



Primary School PE and Sport Funding 2016/17 spending plan

The Government have provided funding of £150 million pounds per annum across the UK. The money that each school receives has been ring fenced so that it can be used to increase participation and improve of the quality of sport and PE for all children. Each school will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus £5 per child.

Following detailed auditing and action planning, we have decided to spend the Sport Premium Grant for the academic year 2016/17 on the following areas. Each allocation will be explained in detail along with the intended impact. Each allocation will be clearly linked to our school's vision of PE and Sport.

1. Allocation: Membership to Mid Cornwall Sports Partnership

The membership of the Mid Cornwall Sports Partnership is vital for the long term development and participation of sport and PE in the school. Although the Partnership is not as well funded, it has provided many opportunities for us to participate in different sporting activities and festivals in previous years. The academy is due to participate in a range of festivals and multi school competitions during the academic year.

2. Use of external multi sports coach

Teachers will again have the chance to work alongside and teach with an external sports coach over the year in a variety of sports. This had a significant impact on developing their confidence and subject knowledge in delivering different sports as was evident in lesson observations. Although only intended as CPD support, throughout the year, the coach will assist in the running of after school sports clubs. These will provide opportunities for children to participate and enjoy sports provision not available in their local area.

3. After School Clubs:

A range of after school clubs will be offered to pupils covering a variety of sporting activities including Tag Rugby, Multi-skills, Cross country, Athletics, Netball and Basketball. Plymouth Argyle will also run a football and multi-skills club subsidised by the sports premium.

4. Provision for Swimming

Sessions will be run in school time for KS2. Using sports premium to pay for an additional swim teacher has, in the past, had a significant impact on the percentage of pupils swimming 25 metres before the end of year 6.

5. Outdoor education provision

Each year group is now taking part in outdoor education experiences. These range from Forest School activities and physical challenges on site to 5 day residential visits which include a diverse and challenging experience. Sports premium money will be used to subsidise these experiences allowing all pupils to take part and benefit from them. A large amount of research has been conducted around the benefits of both physical education and the wider experience of prolonged exposure to a natural environment and the health and wellbeing benefits that can come from these excursions.

6. Youth Sports Trust Membership

Members of staff with areas of development from 2015/16 will attend CPD opportunities provided by our Sports Partnership. Staff who have attended courses, will show development in their teaching of PE through lesson observations. Teachers will have time out of class to work with the external sports coach and PE co-ordinator planning, observing and team teaching. This process is a process that we will continue to provide funding for to ensure the legacy of the Sports Premium Funding is maintained.
