They both received very positive comments and a merit certificate from the adjudicator for performing their chosen poems. Well done girls.

Pentewan Class

This week, Year 6 have been converting between fractions, decimals and percentages and employing a variety of strategies to calculate percentages of amounts. In English, we have been focusing on specific grammar objectives including: the use of passive and active voice, the use of inverted commas and the use of colons and semi-colons. In science we have been looking at the anatomy of the human eye and identifying the function of each part in helping us to see. In topic work, we have explored the Nativity story and begun preparations for helping each class to make 'Christingles', which we will be doing next Thursday. The children have written some superb diary entries as figures from within the Nativity story and we will be choosing some of these to be read in church as part of our Christingle service next Friday

Reading Records

You will notice in this coming week that two new prompt sheets will have been added to your child's reading record. The first of which is a list of suggestions to help structure a reading conversation with your child. These are the types of prompts which adults in school will follow, when reading with your child. It is not necessary to cover each point every time you read but you are welcome to use them to guide your conversations.

The second prompt sheet is a list of useful points, which adults in school use, to consider when providing feedback to your child. They are not a comprehensive list but a suggestion of examples which may be helpful when identifying specific things that your child has done well when reading and any areas that they may need to practise more in the future. You do not need to use these examples but you are welcome to refer to them if you find them helpful.
