Another fantastic week in Year 1! Next week, the children will continue to learn the story of the Little Red Hen and will start to create their own versions of the story. In maths, we will be practicing counting forwards and backwards. We have had a few unnamed jumpers/cardigans left behind this week. Please can you ensure **all** items of clothing are named.

Pendower Class

We have had a really busy week in Year 2 this week. In maths we have been focussing on partitioning 2 digit numbers into tens and ones using lots of practical apparatus and drawings to help us. In storytelling, we have been focussing on how important it is to use capital letters and full stops in our sentences. We have loved learning a little more about The Great Fire and next week we will be starting to look at how the houses were made. Please can children bring in a cardboard box, wither a cereal box or a small box in order for them to make their own Tudor houses.

Charlestown Class

We have had a great week, we have been looking at the grammar of our story An Ancient Discovery, looking at adverbials of time, use of ellipses to build suspense and punctuation for speech. Next week we will be innovating our story, writing our own versions. The children have produced some lovely sentences this week and I look forward to reading their innovations.

In maths we have come to the end of our work on place value, we have been busy ordering, sorting and investigation 3-digit numbers. Next week we will be starting to look at addition and subtraction, using concrete and pictorial methods to begin.

In topic we have been learning about the might of the Roman empire and what made the soldiers so effective. Next week we will begin to design and make our own Roman shields in preparation for practicing Roman army formations. Very exciting times ahead!

Whipsiderry Class

Year 4 had a fantastic first swimming lesson this week, with lots of children showing great resilience and determination. We have been learning about rounding to the nearest whole set of 10 or 100. We are continuing with our story Oliver Twist, thinking about how we can use fronted adverbials to our writing to make it more exciting. Our times tables 10 a day homework has had fantastic result to our class confidence in our knowledge, please keep it up!

Porthcurnow Class

This week the class have been decorating and personalising their wands. In English we have written a newspaper report based on Harry Potter and his friends disappearing into the brick wall on Platform 9 3/4, even giving witness accounts from 'muggles' who may have seen it. In maths we have been multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000 and seeing the effect this has on the place value of each digit. Next week we will be looking at wizard duels, how to play Quidditch and looking at what symbols are used to represent different places on maps.

Firstly, thank you to everyone who came to our welcome meeting on Monday. Year 6 thoroughly enjoyed their taster day at Poltair on Wednesday, where the highlight was definitely science and the use of Bunsen burners! In addition to this, they have begun writing their biographies of Isambard Kingdom Brunel in English. In maths, they have been consolidating their understanding of place value. They have also created their own art deco style images in art.

We will be looking at negative numbers in maths next week

as well as methods for the four operations. We will identify people who we feel have created a great legacy in their chosen field to become the subject of a biography and in science, we will be exploring how different animals have adapted to their environments. We will also be creating adverts to share the benefits presented by the arrival of the railways. Grammar, reading and maths homework has been set this week and is due in next Friday


