Year 1 have been Learning and retelling the story of the three little pigs. In maths they have been learning their Number bonds to 10 and have had a lovely music lesson where they learnt all about pitch.

This week we have worked hard this week at adding 2 digit numbers together using partitioning and base ten. We have also been innovating on our text all about Dragons. We enjoyed learning a bit about different British heroes also.

Next week we will be looking at why we celebrate poppy day and we will also be creating our own mythical creature.

Charlestown Class

Year 3 have had a good week writing a non-chronological report about our trip to the Royal Cornwall Museum. All reports are finished now ready to be edited and written in neat next week before we start our new storytelling into writing text. We have worked hard on rounding to help us estimate addition and have started to look at subtraction as the inverse of addition. Next week we will be looking at written and mental methods for subtraction of 2- and 3-digit numbers. We had a lovely afternoon making poppies ready for remembrance day and a great British Heroes Day. It was wonderful to see all of the children dressed up and sharing their heroes with the rest of the class.

Whipsiderry Class

Year 4 have had a busy week looking at the types of language and word choices used in poetry and beginning in to create their own poems. We have been mastering our understanding of subtraction and as ever continuing on our times tables quest! We are really looking forward to Monday 11th when artist Caroline Cleave is coming to work with us for the day and our families coming to our Community tea party in the afternoon. Swimming also starts again on Wednesday.

Porthcurnow Class

In English, Year 5 have been learning a condensed version of Harry Potter and The Philosopher's Stone, complete with actions. They have been sent home a copy of this story and we would appreciate your support in encouraging them to continue learning it. Next week we will be looking closely at the language features before children will then begin planning their own innovations of the story.

In maths, we have covered using the grid method and column method for multiplication involving 2 digits by 2 digit and 4 digits by 1 digit.

On Monday we will be making our lanterns for the Torchlight Carnival. Please can all children arrive to school in old clothing that you don't mind getting messy.

At 11:00 Year 5, along with the rest of the school, will be attending a service on the school grounds to mark Remembrance day. Children will be planting poppies they have made in class.

Pentewan Class

This week, Year 6 have been writing setting descriptions inspired by RMS Titanic and innovating their own stories set on board the ship. They have been studying 'A night to remember' by Walter Lord in guided reading. In maths, they have been identifying equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions and ordering fractions. They also learned about refraction of light and how rainbows are formed in science. Next week, they are looking forward to creating lanterns for the St Austell Torchlight Parade (remember to wear old clothes on Monday)! They will be progressing to the four operations with fractions in maths and continuing their innovated stories in English. They will also be attempting to build bridges inspired by the Clifton Suspension bridge towards the end of the week. We are hoping to see as many of you as possible next Saturday for the parade (please see Mr F if you need another letter).
