What a great start to Year Two we have had! The children have been fantastic and really excited about their new topic of The Great Fire of London. Next week we will be exploring the time line of this historical event as well as thinking what may have happened for the fire to spread so quickly. We will be continuing to learn about how many tens and ones are in 2 digit numbers and focusing on our sentences in writing. Children have their own spelling books to learn their spellings each week and brand new reading records are there to record all the reads from home.

Charlestown Class

Hello, what a fantastic start to the year we have had in Year 3. All of the children have come into school ready to take on the challenge of KS2 and Mrs Hodkin and myself are really looking forward to teaching your children this year. We have started learning our new text for Storytelling into Writing, An Ancient Discovery, the children will come home today with a copy to continue to learn over the next week. I ask that you get them to tell you the story using only the story map pictures to help them, you can use the text as a prompt. Thank you. We will be looking at the vocabulary and grammar of the text next week before we start our innovations. In maths we have started the year looking at place value within 3-digit numbers. We will continue to explore place value in numbers up to 1000 next week using both concrete and pictorial methods. In Topic we started our topic of Did the Roman's Settle in Cornwall? by looking at the expansion of the Roman army. Next week we will be looking at what made the Roman army so powerful.

Whipsiderry Class

Year 4 are stepping back in time to find out what life would have been like in Victorian England. We have started to find out about working in the local clay industry, and even had a go at creating our own bricks out of clay to make our own engine houses.

This week in maths we have been looking at 4 digit numbers and investigating to round numbers to the nearest whole set of 10. We are as ever also working very hard on our times tables. Our swimming lessons also start next Wednesday!

Porthcurnow Class

Year 5 have had a magical start to the term! It was incredible to see how much time and effort had been put into children's costumes and banquet food for our first day back. The children made feather quills and had a go at writing with them and this week have designed and made their own willow wands! We are looking forward to painting and decorating these next week.

In maths we will continue our 'Place Value' unit- comparing, ordering and understanding numbers to 1,000,000! In English we are now 6 chapters in to 'Harry Potter and The Philosopher's Stone'. Next week we will continue reading and exploring the language used by J.K. Rowling. Children will create their own maps of 'Diagon Alley' as well as their own newspaper reports.

Swimming will be for the first half of the class starting on Wednesday 18th September (the second half will swim during the summer term). P.E will be on Fridays. We look forward to another exciting week!

Pentewan Class

Year 6 have made an excellent start to the new school year. We began our topic for this term (How do you build a great legacy?) by visiting and exploring local sites relating to the Goonbarrow branch line and compared historic photos to what we can see in the present day. In art, we have identified the features of Art Deco travel posters; in history, we have begun to examine the work of Isambard Kingdom Brunel; and in science, we have differentiated between 'inherited' and 'environmental' features. We have also been studying a biography of Nelson Mandela as part of storytelling in English. Next week, we will be planning and writing a biography of Brunel. We will also be learning about the work of Carl Linnaeus - classifying living things - in science and beginning to plan our own art deco travel posters in art.
