School uniform and belongings

Everyday this week staff have had to try to repatriate a significant number of jumpers, coats, lunch boxes and water bottles. I also hear many of you being exasperated that you have been in to look for your child's lost belongings...again. This takes staff a significant amount of time, as you can imagine and can only happen if a pupil's name is clearly in the item. The only labelling that really works is permanent pen- eg a sharpie or a label sewn in/ ironed on. Even with these, regular checking is needed.

This action makes it much easier for school staff and other pupils to return missing items when they are found. As a school we are regularly impressing on the pupils the need to take responsibility for their belongings.

We appreciate how exasperating it is when your child comes home saying they can't find their jumper.... most of the staff are parents too.

Any items of clothing that we have been unable to match to a child will be kept in the classrooms for a week and then moved to the office- other items eg left in hall or outside will go to the office.

have three 'Tables of Trust', these tables are for children who are always showing expected behaviour and are trusted to work well together and are trusted to use their own glue.
