

Treverbyn Academy Newsletter.

Wow, it has been amazing to read all of the things that our pupils are doing during this time of school closure. You have been so busy and many many thanks to parents and carers who have been juggling their workloads and family demands trying to keep home learning going.

Indeed this is the theme of this week's newsletter. Having had requests for home learning packs and speaking with some of you when I was out delivering, this is the conversation that came up time and again.

This concern has been central to the Government and its advisors also this week., with the overwhelming advice being:-

No one expects parents to act as teachers, or to provide the activities and feedback that a school would. What is more important, say educationalists, is maintaining a degree of normality, rather than worrying about a child's progress in English or maths.

How do I support my children?

There are things you can do to make the experience relatively rewarding and stress-free:

Set a routine - if possible, have children dressed and breakfasted by 08:30 on weekdays - this will help them adjust when schools reopen.

Identify a set time of day when you will help children with projects, and other times when they can do things by themselves

Have family time- play games, go for a walk, do things together.

Have regular meal times

To avoid children losing academic skills they don't practise, including reading, writing and maths, make these the most important daily sessions

Don't forget that the school Website has direct links to home learning packs for each year group that are updated every two weeks– weeks 5 and 6 are about to be Uploaded.


