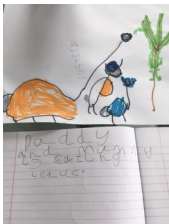
Harlan has had a great week of science experiments and baking with his brother Caiden. Lois has been a super star reader and is climbing her reading mountain!

Oli has been busy counting in fives, working on his number bonds to twenty, learning about the environment and has been learning how to make pasties.

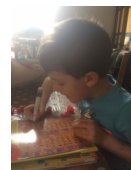
Madi has done some lovely nature art and has produced some great writing too.
